PICKETS. A group of people claiming the bar, After Dark in Los Angeles, is discriminating against Blacks and women, picketed outside the bar from 9:30PM to 12:30AM on Friday and Saturday, Apr. 5 and 6, and on Saturday, Apr. 13. One placard read: "After Dark is after darkies." The Gay Community Services Center organized the demonstration, and Morris Kight, a director of the center, was on the line all three nights. Some people who were headed for the bar joined the picket line, and the demonstrators carried on a friendly dialog with customers. Attorney Thomas Coleman, who had a Black friend refused admittance to the bar, said after the picketing that he has filed a complaint with the State Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control.
