A REPORT FROM
THE SUPREME COURT
AT ONE INSTITUTE ON MAY 4

ONE Institute of Homophile Studies, Los Angeles, continues its 1985-86 Extension Lecture Series on Sunday afternoon, May 4, 1986, presenting Attorney Thomas F. Coleman, who will give an eyewitness report on the history-making oral argument just held before the United States Supreme Court on the constitutionality of the Georgia (and by implication all other) sodomy laws. Tom Coleman has been Co-Chair of the National Committee for Sexual Civil Liberties, Executive Director of the California Governor's Commission on Personal Privacy, and a member of the California Attorney General's Commission on Racial, Ethnic, Religious and Minority Violence. He is also Special Consultant to Councilman Michael Woo's Task Force on Family Diversity and a Lecturer in Law at the University of Southern California, teaching a course on Rights of Domestic Partners. ONE Institute's co-sponsor, the Institute for the Study of Human Resources (founded 1964), has for some time handled funding in support of legal appeals on sexual civil liberties matters coordinated by Attorney Coleman.

The program will be presented in Arlington Hall at 3 pm on Sunday, May 4, 1986. The only access to the campus will be the gate at 12th and Van Ness, one block east of Arlington and one mile north of the Santa Monica Freeway; the gate will open at 2:30 sharp and close at 3:15; parking is on the tennis court. A social hour with light refreshments will follow the program. Admission is \$5 (free for Contributing and Associate Members of ONE-show card).

ONE Institute (co-sponsored by ONE, Inc., founded 1952) has been presenting these lectures since 1956, and operates a Graduate School of Homophile Studies. The important Baker Memorial Library and Archives are also housed on the campus.
